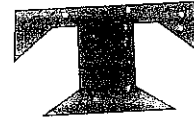

transport (port – carry) – to carry across; carry or move from one place to another

transportation – a system of carrying passengers or goods from one place to another [I'd like to go to the zoo, but I have no transportation.]

transmit (mit – send) – to send across; to broadcast [transmit a disease]

transform – to change in form or appearance [to transform heat into power]

translate – to change from one language to another [The book was translated from English to Spanish.]

far away, distant

television (vis – see) – the transmission of visual images from far away

telephone (phone – sound) – transmitting sound from distant locations

telescope (scope – to look at) – a device for looking at objects far away

telecommunication – communicating from a distance; internet, radio, satellite

telepathy (pathy- feeling) – knowing how someone far away is feeling

temporary – a limited amount of time [a temporary job] [I was temporarily delayed.]

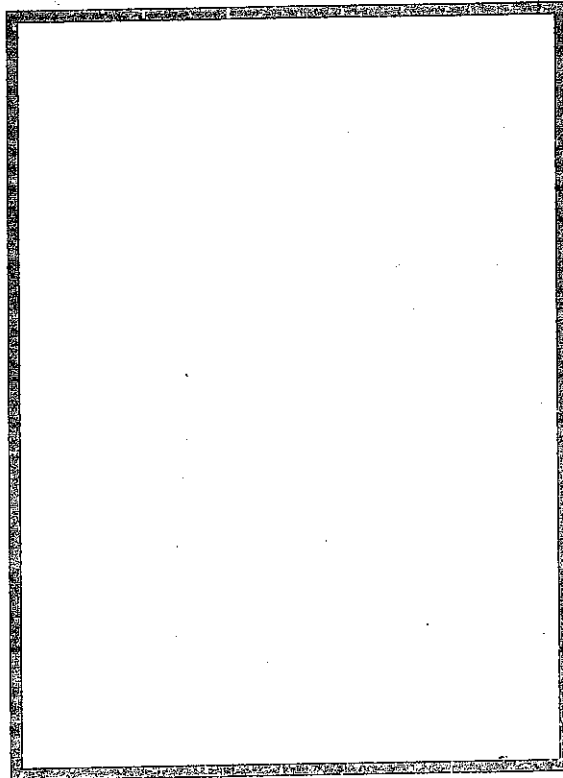
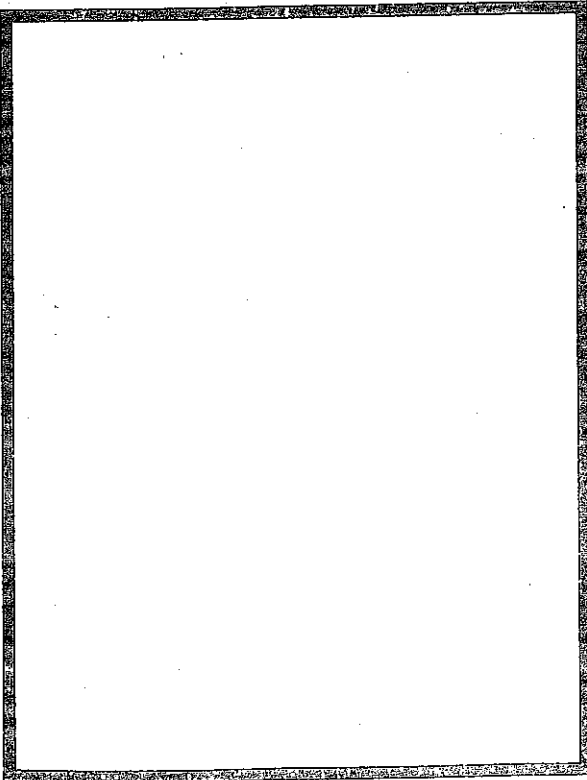
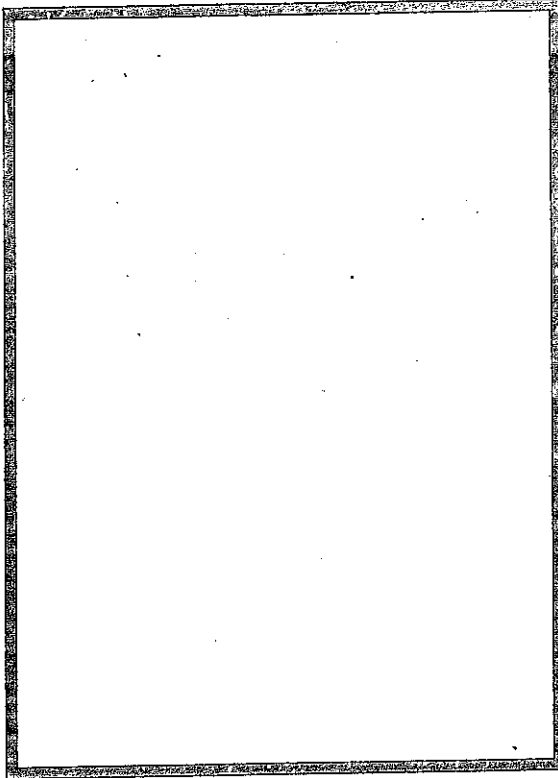
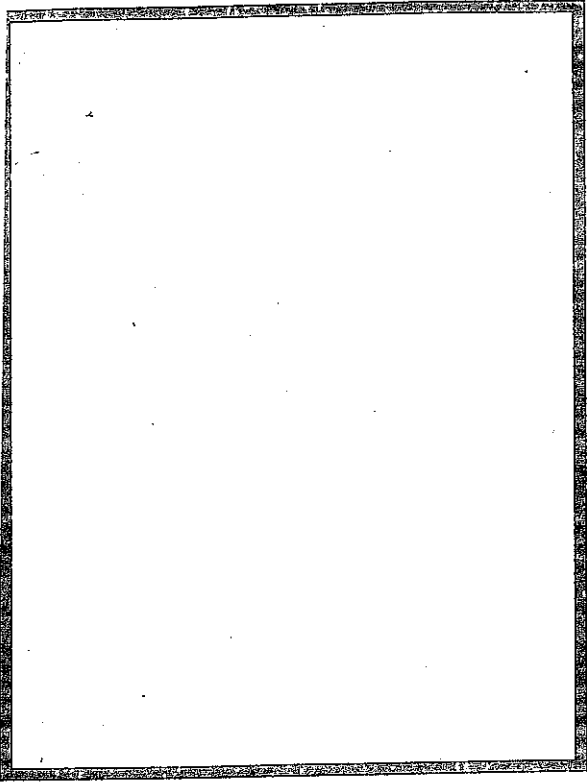
contemporary (con – with) – with the times; modern (She is my contemporary; we went to school together.) (contemporary art)
